MANAGER'S REPORT – Barbara

Barbara welcomed those present and gave the apologies and thanked everyone for their attendance.

Barbara talked about health roster which is part of a new system to record pay hours. This is already on and running well. Co-workers are required to email their work hours as soon as they have worked them. These hours must be reported within 24 hours of the work completed as per the instructions given in the Co-worker Handbook pg. 10 and continued:

- The new system does not have the capacity to go back once the pay period has ended; therefore we will not be able to make payroll adjustments. If co-worker hours are reported late, payments will be much delayed.

The landscape in HIV and hepatitis C has changed substantially over the last five years including: Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) opportunities, faster and easier testing, early access to treatment and improvement in treatments. These have changed the way we think of HIV. New treatments for hepatitis C have also improved health outcomes for community members.

MHAHS has been providing services in these areas since 1992. Now is the time for MHAHS to change to keep up to the new developments in line with the current HIV and hepatitis C landscape.

We are working to update what we do, how we do it, with whom, who do we do it for.

There is no change in our funding. Main change is on the focus of the Service.

At the end of this change process we hope we will continue providing better service to the community at large.


Who are CALD migrants in Australia?

- First, second....generation migrants
- COB, native language, culture and sub-cultures
- Migrant history, previous life experiences, motives
- Visa status
- Gender and sexuality
- Education, employment
- Social network and connection
- Health literacy
- Engagement with services, incl. health services

Background Sydney Gay Asian Men repeated surveys

- Three rounds: 1999 (n=319), 2002 (n=457), 2015-6 (n=501 ongoing)
- 2015-6 recruitment types
 - Gay social venues and events: 18.0%
 - SOPV: 33.7%
 - Clinics (50 from SHCs and 83 from a[Test]): 26.6%
 - Online: 21.7%

Summary

- SGAM (Sydney Gay Asian Men) changed significantly in terms of their HIV testing patterns, the extent of engagement with clinical care and community services, and their HIV-related sexual practices (e.g. CLAIC)
- An increasing yet still niche demand to cater for the needs of SGAM, particularly in the area of HIV and STI prevention (mostly young, uninfected men)
- The role of SHCs in promoting HIV and STI testing among SGAM (critical mass, authority, cultural sensitivity, service referral/co-ordination)
